



ERASMUS POLICY STATEMENT

Our institution, CESUGA (Centro de Estudios Superiores Universitarios de Galicia) located in La Coruña, Spain, has been successfully delivering national and international higher degree programmes for over 25 years. From 1995 to 2017 two of our degree programmes were accredited by University College Dublin and simultaneously as of 2014 our four degree programmes have been under the accreditation of Universidad San Jorge in Zaragoza, Spain. Our Centre aspires to gain full university status within the coming years. CESUGA's overall strategy lies in a constant pursuit of academic and human excellence. It is our policy that both educators and staff form part of this on-going mechanism for improvement and change. Therefore, participation in the Erasmus+ programme adds new opportunities of enhancement for creating a more modernized internationally-driven institution.

Our primary goal is to establish systems where students and staff are able to increase their capacity in becoming life-long thinkers and ongoing learners. This enrooted belief is essential for improving both personal and professional development.

Our main targets are to increase both the number of students and staff on the mobility programme. We envisage these and other essential improvements in order to fully participate in the European Education Area by 2025.
